

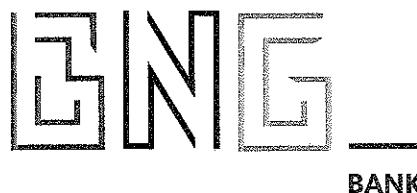

Risks to growth and stability stem mainly from continued imbalances – among and within countries – and from uncertainty about how economies will respond as the extraordinary monetary policy measures, including the quantitative easing programs, implemented during the global financial and economic crisis are unwound.
